- West Bay Disposal Site Enforcement Problems: The CAO/Clerk advised the Committee about the situation at the West Bay Site involving the assault of a contract staff person and the continued harassment issues taking place. She advised that the O.P.P. have been called. She stated that these incidents cannot be ignored and there were a few ways in which things could be handled. The persons involved could be banned from the landfill for a specific period and directed to use another landfill site or banned permanently. Deputy-Reeve Bill Davis stated that the Municipality should be tough immediately and act on the situation and not move it to another landfill site. The Committee agreed to send letters stating that further incidents could result in a complete ban from the landfill site and/or charges. Bruce Bozec suggested providing patrons at the landfill sites a notice advising that all regulations need to be adhered to or privileges will be lost. This will let everyone know that the Municipality will not condone this type of behavior. Councillor Knowles noted the need to ensure compliance is being enforced at the Haliburton Landfill Site as well.
- Home Show Participation: The Committee was invited to participate in the Home Show Event and after a brief discussion decided not to attend this year.

Dumping on
Municipal
Property in
Industrial Park:

Mark Brohm advised the Committee that some dumping had taken place on the municipal property in Industrial Park but it was commercial dumping which was likely happening because the previous owner allowed fill to be dumped in that area. There is a pontoon boat on the property. Mr. Brohm felt that the lot should be cleared and closed off to try and stop further dumping. It was suggested to post signage as well. It was also noted that Rodco had empty tractor trailers in the area and a letter would be sent to them advising to have them removed.

Waste
Containers:

Bruce Bozec provided the Committee with information from EcoMedia regarding their silver box recycling units. The company supplies a three stream system free of charge to the municipality by charging for advertising on the units. A five year agreement with the Municipality is required. Mr. Bozec also advised that they also have portable units that can be rented for \$70.00 for a four week period. The Committee agreed to investigate renting a few units over the summer for the park area and see how they work out. In the interim, signage will be put on the current garbage containers to show where to put recycling.

The CAO/Clerk explained to the Committee the plans for the Streetscape Project and advised that if the Municipality receives funding for this project recycling and waste containers will be incorporated into the design.

It is a very costly and extensive project and Council will have to determine what their plans are for the future of the site. The site is close to reaching it's capacity and if it is not mined, the site may have to be closed or turned into a transfer site.
