- Adoption of Agenda: Res. No. 63, Bill Davis, Derek Knowles

- Memo from CAO Re: Plastic Bag Pilot Project: The Committee members reviewed the memo from the CAO/Clerk regarding the plastic bag pilot project for the Haliburton Landfill Site.
Mr. Bozec indicated that some people are giving favourable comments on the bag separation at the landfill site, and people are generally doing this on their own now.
Deputy-Reeve Davis noted that a Cambridge company would pay us \$.03 per pound of plastic which is shipped overseas.
Mr. Bozec indicated that he had received a price of \$40.00 per tonne for the product. He further indicated the need to have the bins covered.
A discussion ensued regarding the benefits to be achieved from separation of the plastic bags. Councillor Kay expressed that a cleaner product should result in the Municipality being paid for the material.
Mr. Bozec indicated the need to reorganize the Haliburton site and force one way traffic flow. He further indicated that the shed needs to be moved to a better location.
It was noted that additional 40-yard containers are needed and pole barn type covers need to be built over the containers.
It was agreed that the plastic bag separation at the Haliburton Landfill Site should continue. Mr. Bozec noted that an additional baler may be required to bale the plastic and Mr. Bozec was directed to look into the options in this regard.
Mr. Bozec was requested to follow up with MCS on the processing fees for the cleaner product being shipped from this site.
Mr. Bozec felt that covers for the recycling containers could be constructed by staff from material at the sites.
- Compactor Proposal: The Committee reviewed the compactor proposal from MCS and the cost comparison and information obtained by the CAO/Clerk. It was felt that the compactor proposal should not be pursued at this time.
