

MUNICIPALITY OF DYSART ET AL

BY-LAW NO. 99-47

**BEING A BY-LAW TO REGULATE THE USE OF
BICYCLES, SKATEBOARDS, ROLLER SKATES AND
OTHER VEHICLES AND CONVEYANCES**

WHEREAS pursuant to paragraph 105 of Section 210 of the Municipal Act, R.S.O. 1990, c.M.45, as amended, Council may pass by-laws prohibiting coasting on highways.

AND WHEREAS pursuant to paragraph 42 of Section 208 of the Municipal Act, R.S.O. 1990, Council may pass by-laws prohibiting the use of any particular class or kind of conveyance along or upon any sidewalk, footpath or pathway.

AND WHEREAS it is desirable to prohibit the use of bicycles, skateboards, roller skates, in-line skates and similar conveyances on certain streets and sidewalks.


NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the United Townships of Dysart et al enacts as follows:

1. (1) In this By-law:
 - (a) "Bicycle" includes a tricycle and a unicycle but does not include a child's tricycle or bicycle with a wheel size less than 14 inches, or a vehicle or other device for the physically handicapped.
 - (b) "Highway" includes a common and public highway, street, avenue, parkway, driveway, square, place, bridge, viaduct or trestle, and includes the area between the lateral property lines thereof.
 - (c) "Sidewalk" means any path or walkway on a highway whether improved or unimproved that has been designed, set apart, or intended for the exclusive use of pedestrians and includes sidewalks, hereinbefore or hereinafter constructed by the Township of Dysart et al on district roads.
- (2) Without limiting the generality of the definition in paragraph 1.(1)(b) "highway" includes the roadway, the shoulders, sidewalks, curbing, boulevards and any other portions of a highway that might be found within the lateral property lines thereof.
2. No person shall, at any time, use, drive or operate a bicycle on any sidewalk in the Village of Haliburton.
3. No person shall, at any time, use or operate skateboards, roller skates, in-line skates or other similar conveyances, devices or modes of transportation on sidewalks along the following roads or walkways:
 - (a) Maple Avenue
 - (b) Highland Street
 - (c) York Street
 - (d) Mountain Street

4. Any person who contravenes any provision of this by-law is guilty of an offence and upon conviction is liable to pay a fine pursuant to the Provincial Offences Act.
5. Every person who is guilty of an offence under this by-law may, if permitted under the Provincial Offences Act, pay a set fine, and the Chief Judge of the Ontario Court (Provincial Division) shall be requested to establish, pursuant to the Provincial Offences Act, set fines in accordance with Schedule "A" attached to this by-law.
6. This by-law shall come into force and take effect upon the date of third and final reading.
7. By-law No. 98-85 is hereby rescinded.
