## MUNICIPALITY OF DYSART ET AL

## BY-LAW NO. 79-22

A BY-LAW TO PROHIBIT AND REGULATE THE DISCHARGE OF GUMS AND OTHER FIREARMS IN DESIGNATED AREAS WITHIN THE LIMITS OF THE UNITED TOWNSHIPS OF DYSART, DUDLEY, HARCOURT, GUILFORD, HARBURN, BRUTON, HAVELOCK, EYRE, AND CLYDE.

WHEREAS it is deemed necessary in the interests of the safety of the inhabitants of the Municipality of Dysart et al, and the protection of animals therein to prohibit the use or discharge of guns and other firearms in certain designated areas;

AND WHEREAS authority is granted pursuant to Section 354, Subsection 1, par. 30, of The Municipal Act, Chapter 284, R.S.O. 1970, as

MOW THEREFORE the Municipal Council of the United Townships of Dysart et al enacts as follows:

- (1) All persons are prohibited from using or discharging any type of guns or other firearms within a distance of one-half kilometer from the boundary of any area designated as a Municipal Landfill Site, as defined in By-Law Mo. 78-13 of, the Municipality of Dysart et al.
- (2) For the purpose of this By-Law, anyone found carrying any type of gun or other firearm unless encased or otherwise enclosed, within the boundary of the areas as described above, shall be deemed to be using and discharging the same therein.
- (3) Police Officials hereby authorized to enforce the provisions of this By-Law in the performance of their lawful duties.
- (4) Any person found to be in contravention of any of the provisions of this By-Law, shall be guilty of an offence, and upon Summary Conviction be liable to a fine of not more than \$50.00, exclusive of costs, for the first offence, and offence.
- (5) This By-Law shall come into force upon final approval by the Municipal Council of the United Townships of Dysart et al, and thereafter until repealed by the same, save and except the period in the month of November in each and every year proclaimed by the Ministry of Natural Resourses to be open season for the purpose of hunting deer.
- (6) By-Laws 61-9, and 61-10 of the Municipality of Dysart et al are hereby repealed.

THIS BY-LAW READ A FIRST AND SECOND TIME this 9th day of April, 1979.

THIS BY-LAW READ A THIRD TIME AND FINALLY PASSED this 9th day of April, 1979.
