CONDITIONS OF ENTRANCE PERMIT

- Work on the construction or alteration of an entrance <u>must not</u> be started until an ENTRANCE PERMIT for the work has been issued by the Roads Department of the Municipality of Dysart et al.
- 2. The application for an ENTRANCE PERMIT must be accompanied by a drawing, clearly showing the work to be carried out on the entrance and all other features in the entrance area. These features shall include: edge of road; existing ditch; trees; shrubs; visible utility locations.
- 3. The identification sign (supplied upon payment) must be erected at the location for the site inspection performed by Municipal staff. Should this sign not be posted by the date specified and a site inspection is attempted by Municipal staff, the applicant will be required to reapply.
- 4. All work related to an entrance shall be performed in accordance with the approved plans and specifications and subject to approval of the Municipality of Dysart et al.
- 5. The approved work must be completed and the site completely restored, in accordance with **Entrance Specifications** within thirty (30) days of the commencement date.
- 6. The design and specifications of an entrance must not be changed without the approval of the Roads Superintendent.
- 7. The applicant shall, at his own expense and at any time on receipt of thirty (30) days notice, suspend operation, remove, alter or relocate any or all of the works of an entrance as may be requested by Roads Department. If a dangerous situation has occurred and is not immediately rectified, the Municipality may remove the works and the costs may be added to taxes for collection.
- 8. An ENTRANCE PERMIT may be cancelled at any time for a breach of regulations or conditions of the Permit or for such other reasons as Roads Superintendent in his discretion deems proper.
- 9. If, during the life of this Permit, and regulations are adopted which affect the rights and privileges herein granted, the regulations shall be applicable to this Permit from the date on which they come into force.
- 10. Please refer also to Policy No. 09 (revised) "To create a minimum standard for driveway entrances and have a safer environment for vehicles entering Municipal roadways."

Policy No. 09 (revised)

Purpose: To create a minimum standard for driveway entrances and have a safer environment for vehicles entering Municipal roadways. This standard creates a situation whereby property owners are not running water down driveways onto the Municipal roadway.

- 1. The Corporation of the United Townships of Dysart et al hereby declares that the following are the minimum standards acceptable for a residential entrance to a Municipal road:
 - a. If a culvert is required, the pipe must be a minimum of thirty (30) feet in length and made of plastic, if possible. The length and diameter will be determined by the Road Superintendent or designate. The driving surface of the driveway shall come as close as practable to the ends of the culvert.
 - All entrances on newly created lots and having a downward slope must have a grade no greater than 3% for a distance of 6 meters when leaving the roadway. (see standard Rural entrance standard drawing)
 - c. All entrances on newly crated lots and having an upward slope must have a grade of not more than .5% for a distance of 6 meters when leaving the roadway. (see standard Rural entrance standard drawing)
 - d. All entrances on lots currently in existence as of the passing of this standard will be looked at on a case by case basis.
 - e. If the depth of fill on top of the culvert exceeds three (3) feet, cribbing is required at each side of the entrance to stop erosion.
 - f. A clear site line of one hundred (100) feet or greater will be obtained if possible.
 - g. Urban entrance specifications shall be specified by the Road superintendent, or designate on a site specific basis.
- Application for entrance approval shall be made to the Municipality, to the attention
 of the Road Superintendent, or designate, by completing the prescribed form and
 paying the applicable fee.
- 3. At no time under any circumstance can a property owner run water onto a Municipal roadway.
