' Canada are landfilled or incinerated. 11 % Canada are landfilled or incinerated.
These plastics fill our landfills, pollute our waterways and forests and can take 450 years or more to decompose.



Our Blue Box residue rate has dropped from 14.5% (2011) to 3.93% (2017).

Through increased education and awareness, Dysart residents have improved their sorting methods significantly in recent years, but there is still room for further improvement.
